INTRODUCTORY COMMENT

Floor scrubber-dryer, via the mechanical action of the rotating brush and the chemical action of a water/detergent solution, can clean any type of flooring. As it advances, it also collects the dirt removed and the detergent solution not absorbed by the floor. Even the best machines will only work well if used correctly and kept in good working order. We therefore suggest you read this instruction booklet carefully and read it again whenever difficulties arise while using the machine. If necessary, remember that our assistance service (organized in collaboration with our dealers) is always available for advice or direct intervention.

GENERAL SAFETY REGULATIONS

The regulations below must be carefully followed in order to avoid harm to the operator and damage to the machine.

- Read the labels on the machine carefully. Do not cover them for any reason and replace them immediately if they become damaged.
- ◆ The machine must be used exclusively by authorized, trained personnel.
- During the working of the machine, pay attention to other people and especially to children.
- ◆ Do not mix different types of detergent as this may produce harmful gases.
- Do not pack the machine when there is residual liquid in it.
- ◆ The storage temperature must be between -25°C and +55°C.
- Conditions of use: room temperature between 0°C and 40°C with relative humidity between 30 and 95%.
- ◆ Do not use the machine in an explosive atmosphere.
- Do not use the machine as a means of transport.
- Do not use acid solutions, which may damage the machine or harm the operator.
- Avoid working with the brushes when the machine is standing still, so as not to damage the floor.
- ♦ Do not vacuum inflammable liquids
- Do not use the device to collect dangerous powders.
- ♦ In the event of a fire, use a powder extinguisher. Do not use water.
- ♦ Do not knock against shelving or scaffolding, where there is a danger of falling objects.
- Select the operating speed according to the traction status.
- Do not use the machine on surfaces with an inclination greater than the one shown on the plate.
- When not in use, remove the keys and place the machine in a proper way to keep still.
- ◆ The machine is designed to carry out the washing and drying operations simultaneously. Different operations should only be carried out in areas where the passage of unauthorized persons is prohibited. Signal the presence of damp floors with suitable signs.
- ♦ If the machine does not work properly, check this is not caused by failure to carry out routine maintenance. Otherwise, request the intervention of your dealer After-sale Service Centre.
- If you need to replace any components, request the ORIGINAL spare parts from a dealer or Authorized Retailer..
- Only use the brushes supplied with the device, or those specified in the Use and Maintenance Manual.
- ◆ Pull down the emergency brake immediately when there is an operation risk.
- Before carrying out any maintenance work, switch off the machine and disconnect the battery connector.
- ♦ Make sure the whole electrical connection is recovered after maintenance.
- ◆ Do not remove any protection devices which require the use of special tools.
- ◆ Do not wash the machine with corrosive substances or with pressurized water.
- ◆ Send the machine to a Service Center nearby for servicing after 200 hours of use.
- ◆ To prevent the formation of scale in the solution tank filter, do not fill the tank with detergent solution many hours before using the machine.
- Before using the machine, check that all the hatches and covers are positioned as shown in this Manual.
- Before moving the recovery tank, empty the water.
- ♦ When disposing of consumption materials, observe the laws and regulations in force.
- ♦ When your machine has reached the end of its long working life, dispose of the materials it contains in an appropriate manner (e.g. oil, batteries and electric parts), and bearing in mind that the machine itself was constructed using 100% recyclable materials.

I. MACHINE PREPARATION HANDLING THE PACKED MACHINE

The machine is fixed to a pallet, which is specially designed for forklift handling..


HOW TO UNPACK THE MACHINE

- 1.Remove the outer packaging (as figure)
- 2.The machine is fixed to the pallet with wedges and belts which block the wheel.
- 3. Remove these belts.
- 4. Get the machine down from the pallet.

INSERTING THE BATTERIES

The batteries should be correctly placed in the battery box below the recovery tank.

The type of battery must comply with CEI21-5 description. Inserting the batteries as follows (as figure):


- 1.Raise the recovery tank backwards.
- 2.House the batteries in the compartment, positioning the poles "+" and "-"opposite each other.



CONNECTING THE BATTERIES (AS FIGURE)

Connect the charger to the battery connector cable. The battery connector is put together with this Manual in one package.

You are advised to have the electric connections made by a professional. Any error would harm the operator and damage the machine.



TYPE OF BATTERY

To power the machine there are three types of batteries below:

Lead-acid battery composed of liquid plumbic acid, called WET Battery.

Liquid electrolyte lead traction batteries, called AGM Battery.

Sealed traction batteries with gas recombination or gel technology, called GEL Battery.

OTHER TYPES MUST NOT BE USED

Max size of the battery: Length=335mm Width=180mm Height=218mm

Max weight of the battery: 36kg.

Connect two 12V batteries in series to obtain a voltage of 24V on the clamps. The connection must be operated by a qualified,

BATTERY MAINTENANCE

For maintenance and recharging, respect the instructions provided by the battery manufacturer. Particular attention must be paid when choosing the battery charger, if not supplied, since there are different kinds according to the type and capacity of the battery.

BATTERY DISPOSAL

When the battery reaches the end of its working life, it must be disconnected by expert, trained personnel, then lifted to remove it from the battery compartment.

Exhausted batteries are classified as dangerous waste. When disposing, observe the laws and regulations in force.

RECHARGING THE BATTERIES

In order not to cause permanent damage to the batteries it is essential to avoid their complete discharge: arrange the recharge within a few minutes of the switching on of the flashing "discharged batteries" signal.

NOTE: never leave the batteries completely discharged, even if the machine is not being used. While recharging, keep the recovery tank raised, supporting it with the cable, as shown in the figure. Check the battery charger is suitable for the batteries installed, in terms of both capacity and type.

VOLTMETER

The battery charging status display table has 10 segments of LED light display.3 colors of light column. These colors represent different charging states.

10 section = 100%


Green = plenty of electricity

Yellow = the remaining 30% of the battery

Red = low power, need to be charged.

You are advised that when you use the AGM battery, the yellow indicator lights up, you can use the our company's smart charger for charging.






ASSEMBLING THE SQUEEGEE

For packaging reasons, the squeegee is supplied disassembled from the machine, and must be assembled on the machine connection. Fix the squeegee to the Support frame assembly (N) with bolt as figure.


Then connect the Suction pipe (G) to the squeegee.



ADJUSTING THE HEIGHT OF SQUEEGEE

Adjust the height according to the rubber as follows:

Rotate the adjuster (J) clockwise to raise the squeegee, anticlockwise on the contrary.






Rotate the adjuster of both sides simultaneously to keep the squeegee parallel with the ground.

RECOVERY TANK

Turn over the Recovery tank and check the joint of the suction pipe, sewage pipe and recovery tank to see if all components are connected correctly and sealed well. Further check whether the suction pipe G and the suction port F, and the sewage pipe P and the sewage pipe plug Q are connected correctly and sealed well.



SOLUTION TANK

Remove the front inlet cap, fill it with clean water.




CLEAN WATER

Fill the solution tank with clean water at a temperature not exceeding 50°C.Add the liquid detergent to the tank in the concentration and manner indicated on the detergent manufacturer's label. The formation of excess foam could damage the suction motor, so use only the minimum amount of detergent necessary. Cover the tank with cap(R).

You are advised to always use low foam detergents and add a little anti-foam reagent to solution tank. Do not use pure acids!

ASSEMBLING THE BRUSH


1. At first, turn the key to position "0" to turn off the power.





2. With the base up, place the brushes into the plate housing beneath the base, turning the brushes until the three pins enter the niches in the plate itself; turn until the pin is pushed towards the coupling spring and is locked into place. The figure shows the rotation direction for coupling the brush









II.WORK

PREPARING TO WORK

- 1. Connect the connector to the batteries;
- 2. Place the main switch key in the ON position (clockwise) and the LCD will light up immediately.
- 3. Rotate the water tap to adjust the flow. Select an appropriate level. The water falls automatically while the brushes are turning. You are advised to adjust the level according to the movement speed and the type of floor and dust;
- 4. Press the brush switch to lower the head.
- 5. Lower the squeegee, rotating the squeegee lifting lever (R).

WORKING


Forward: press the brush switch and water absorption switch, and then hold the micro-switch with both hands, the machine will move forward or backward; Release the micro switch and the machine stops.




When making even brief reverse movements, check the squeegee is raised.

During the first meters, check there is sufficient solution and that the squeegee dries perfectly. The machine will now start to work efficiently until the detergent solution runs out.

When there is an operation risk. Please turn down the power including the Key switch. Restart the machine after trouble shooting.





SOLUCTION TANK ALQRM DEVICE

When the water in the Soluction tank is used up, the liquid level sensor will alarm, and the LCD display on the control panel will indicate that in order to avoid damage to the brush motor, it should stop running. Fill it with clean water before it can work.

RECOVERY TANK ALQRM DEVICE

When the water in the Recovery tank is full, the liquid level sensor will alarm, and the LCD display on the control panel will indicate that in order to avoid damage to the water absorption motor, it should be opened immediately, and the machine should stop working, and the Recovery tank should be empty.



This operation must be carried out using gloves to protect against contact with dangerous solutions.

AT THE END OF THE WORK

- 1. Press the brush switch to lift the head.
- 2. Lift the squeegee by the lever(R).
- 3. Park the machine where the recovery tank can be emptied.
- 4. Turn the key switch to "OFF" to switch off the machine.
- 5. Remove the drainage tube(P) from its compartment.
- 6. Unscrew the drainage cap (Q) and empty the recovery tank.



These operations must be carried out using gloves to protect against contact with dangerous solutions

Disassemble the brushes and clean them with a jet of water (to disassemble the brushes, see "DISASSEMBLING THE BRUSHES" below).

III. DAILY MAINTENANCE

CLEANING THE RECOVERY TANK

- 1. Remove the Sewage pipe.
- 2. Remove the cap and empty the tank.

These operations must be carried out using gloves to protect against contact with dangerous solutions

- 3. Rinse the inside of the tank well with a jet of water, then empty the tank:
- 4. Rinse all the elements with a jet of water to make clean
- 5. Reassemble all the elements



CLEANING THE SUCTION FILTER

1. Remove the suction filter from its seat.

Use a jet of water to clean the walls and base of the filter.

2. Reassemble all the elements.

CLEANING THE SQUEEGEE


Check the squeegee is always clean, for better drying results, to clean it you must:

- 1. Remove the tube (G) from the squeegee.
- 2. Release the Squeegee fixed nut, then take down the squeegee.
- 3. Carefully clean the inside of the squeegee and rubbers.
- 4. Every week, or whenever suction seems to be unsatisfactory, check the squeegee tube is not obstructed.
- 5. Reassemble all the elements again.



DISASSEMBLING THE BRUSH

- 1. Press the brush switch to lift the head;
- 2. Turning the brush to the direction that The figure shows the rotation;
- 3. If you will not use the machine long time. Please disassembling the brush, then keep it clean and dry.





CLEANING THE BATTERY BOX

Whenever keep the battery and box clean with duster. Check out jumper cables and insulation base to make sure connecting firmly. If not it will lead to the jumper cables heat. Then the battery will be under the influence of that.

This operation must be carried out using gloves to protect against contact with dangerous solutions.



REPLACING THE SQUEEGEE RUBBERS


Check the wear of the rubber. If the wear is severe, please replace it according to the following procedure:

- 1. Pull the suction pipe G from the suction mouth F of the squeegee;
- 2. Turn the nut O on the squeegee assembly;
- 3. Remove the suction tip from the support.
- 4. Loosen the fixing screw S on the rubber fixing plate and remove the fixing steel bar T;
- 5. Replace the rubber U, two pieces.




IV. WEEKLY MAINTENANCE

V. TROUBLE SHOOTING

Before you take it to repair or call our customer service to help, you should check out those problems.

VI. CHOOSING AND USING THE BRUSHES POLYPROPYLENE BRUSH (PPL)

Used on all types of floors. Good resistance to wear and tear, and hot water (no greater than 60°C). The Polypropylene brush is non-hygroscopic and therefore retains its characteristics even when working in wet conditions.

NYLON BRUSH

Used on all types of floors. Good resistance to wear and tear, and hot water (no greater than 60°C). The Nylon brush is hygroscopic and easy-extended; as a result it cannot retain its characteristics when working in wet conditions.

ABRASIVE BRUSH

The bristles of this type of brush are extremely hard. It is used to clean very dirty floors. To avoid floor damage, work only with the pressure strictly necessary.

STEEL BRUSH

It is made up of steel wire and artificial fiber blends and used to clean rough roads, floors with big joints or dirt which is difficult to clean up.

THICKNESS OF THE BRISTLES

Thicker bristles are more rigid and are therefore used on smooth floors or floors with small joints. On uneven floors or those with deep joints, it is advisable to use softer bristles which can enter the gaps more easily.

Remember that when the bristles are worn and therefore too short, they will become rigid and are no longer able to penetrate and clean deep down. In this case, like with over-large bristles, the brush tends to jump.
